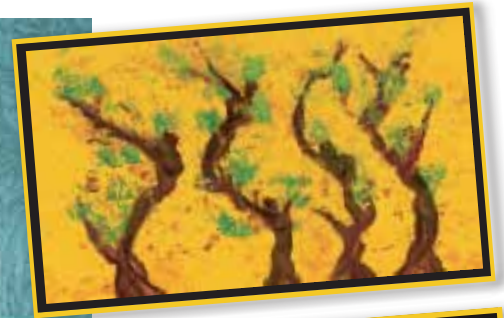

Chardonnay is among the most debated grape varieties around; everyone, it seems, has an opinion about what it should be. Rich and fruity? Oaky and buttery? Steely and crisp? But look at all those styles together, and it's America's most popular wine—we drank over 53 million cases of it in 2010. Recently, in a blind taste test of more than 100 under-\$15 bottles, these were the 10 winners.

2009 Four Vines Naked (\$13)
No oak (hence, "naked") gets in the way of this wine's bright, pineappley flavors.
